Minutes of the November 20, 2015 meeting: Motion by Gail Spencer and second by Joyce Gaudet to approve the November 20, 2015, minutes as submitted. Motion approved.

Treasurer Report: Kalynn Oleson: Previous balance was \$11,475.85. Income from dues, retreat, angel gifts, and fundraising totaled \$2,719.00. Expenses totaled \$1,634.57 for new checks, PPQG banner, and retreat. Ending balance is now \$12,560.28. Received, today, a check from GAC for \$2998.94 for income from FOT sales which will be reflected in next months report.

Program Committee: Kalynn Oleson: Francie Angwin and Marcia Luchini have volunteered to be the new Program Committee. They will be working with Kalynn to develop the Program for 2017. Francie and Marcia welcome and encourage your suggestions for workshops and/or lecturers.

February 19 meeting will be a lecture by Sandra Bruce on Material Matrix and Pathway Taken. March 16 & 17 will be a workshop by Jennifer Sampou followed by her lecture at the March 18 Guild meeting. Look on Google for an indication of her work.

Continuing Education Committee: Kalynn Oleson and Jan Carter: Beginning Quilting class is scheduled and can be viewed on the GAC website. Classes will be 4 consecutive Thursdays, beginning February 18 from 9:30 AM through 4:00 PM. Pass the word, sign up, encourage others to sign up. Minimum enrollment is 6.

20th Anniversary Celebration: Barbara Dunsmoor

A selection of quilts and verbiage announcing the Twentieth Anniversary has been finalized and presented to Arena Theater. They will prepare a presentation to run at the Theater for viewers waiting for the movie to begin.

Memory Quilt (Judy Riddle): Currently 16 of the 20 individual blocks are complete. These blocks are outstanding. Block titles will be embroidered on sashing. The embroidery will be picked up on Saturday for review and approval. Then the committee will construct the quilt.

Challenge (Laura Hamilton): Quilt turn-in is Monday, May 2, from noon until 3:00 PM; opening reception is Wednesday, May 4; pick up will be Monday, May 30 from noon until 3:00 PM. Note: (1) the opening reception is on a Wednesday evening, not a Friday as it has been in the past; (2) turn in and pick up time is noon, not 10:00 AM as it has been in the past; (3) Pick up day is Monday, May 30, which is Memorial Day. If you can't pick up your quilt by 3:00 PM, ask someone to pick it up for you or you will pay GAC \$5 a day until you pick it up. Registration form is being revised and should be available soon.

Celebration Dinner (Kalynn Oleson): Caterer is Leslie Bates. Exact menu coming later. Date is the evening of Saturday, May 14. Cost of dinner will be \$45 per person. Invitation will be

open to current guild members and their significant other, as well as past members. If you have the current address for any former members, please send them to Kalynn so invitations can be mailed to them.

Cookbook (Carole Garcia): Everything has gone to the publisher. Thank you to Judy and Larry Riddle for designing the book cover. Proofs are scheduled to arrive in February and the books received in mid March. Some payments for pre-orders have been received, but need more. Contact Carole if you want to pre-order more books, or if you can't remember how many you pre-ordered. Cost is \$15.00 per book. Make checks payable to PPQG and either mail check to Carole or bring it to the February guild meeting. Three local businesses have agreed to sell the cookbooks in their store. Barbara will confirm with them before publishing who these businesses are. Guild members will also be asked to sell cookbooks.

Comfort Quilts: Joyce Gaudet: Thank you to everyone for coming today. We had a great turn out. Recently received requests for 4 people to receive comfort quilts. The stash is low. Joyce had 12 quilts in September and now has only 4. Polly may have 6. More quilts are needed.

Quilts of Valor: Sandy Lockhart: Sandy Hughes will be making more QOV labels. Sandy Lockhart currently has 6 quilts. Preliminary plan is to deliver quilts in late spring. Would like to have a minimum of 15 quilts.
