

Pacific Piecemaker's Quilt Guild  
General Meeting  
February 16, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm by president Cheryl Faconti. There were 32 people present, including three guests/new people: Joanne Brooks, Bonnie Handley, and Leanne Liston.

Announcements: Bette Covington's husband died suddenly this week. She is requesting that we respect her privacy at this time. Cheryl introduced a charity called Project Night-Night. They are collecting baby blankets (blankets, quilts, or afghans) for homeless children. The size is 50" by 60" or less. Contact her if you have a quilt you'd like to donate.
