Featured Member

A woman with a colorful past, Iris Lorenz-Fife is our Featured Member this month. She was born and raised in Australia. It was fashionable in that country for young women to travel before marrying, so when she was 20 Iris boarded the ocean liner Patrice to travel to India. On board she met a charming Italian, Gianni Lorenzini, with whom she motorbiked through the Middle East. After a brief stay in Italy, the couple moved to London to work and get married before moving to Canada. They arrived during the worst snow storm in 20 years. They lived in Toronto for two years where Iris worked as a secretary.



When the snow became “too much” for a girl from Australia she gave her husband an ultimatum, “I’m going south, you coming?” They first toured Alaska and the mainland US before they settled in Burlingame, California, where it was warm and the eucalyptus trees reminded Iris of home. Next they took a twelve month sabbatical to tour Central and South America by Volkswagen bus. Having frequently camped in Salt Point State Park, in 1995 Iris decided to move to Annapolis where, with Gianni’s help (they are still friends despite being divorced), she built a house. Iris continued her career as a free-lance journalist by writing her fourth book, Financing Your Business, using dictation software, but after that she cut back on her 20 year career as a writer.

Iris learned to sew as a child. Her mother was a dressmaker and Iris learned the fundamentals from her; however, it was her grandmother who inspired her. When Iris was three years of age her grandmother ran a treadle sewing machine while Iris stood between her legs and directed what should be sewn. Of course Gramma couldn’t see where Iris’ fingers were.

In 2000 Iris joined PPQG because of the good lectures at meetings. Gayle Stewart, one of the founders of PPQG, became her mentor as Iris started quilting. Her first challenge piece was named “Twenty thousand years before 2000” and was made with the challenge gold and silver lame`s. Iris likes to make “art quilts.” She is known for the often dramatic design of her pieces, but she says that while she doesn’t like to piece, she loves quilting. She now owns a long-arm quilting machine which is “owner-operated” not run by computer.

Iris has been the PPQG Librarian for many years. She takes well-earned pride in getting the library organized. She says that it is “halfway done.” She hopes to add books featuring art quilts to inspire herself and others.
