You may find inspiration for your entry for the 2008 Challenge in the PPQG library, the public library, or even your personal library. It might be a book on quilting, a novel, or...well, what do you find inspiring in a library? The deadline for applications is February 22 with the show scheduled for March 8th through April 6th. There is a \$10.00 entry fee for any quilts not for sale. Quilts offered for sale have no entry fee. Each person may enter a maximum of two quilts. Group quilts may be entered in addition. For our show we would like to include images of the books that inspire the quilts. If you cannot provide a scan of the book please see Anna Hines to make arrangements. Only six months to go!

All PPQG members, beginners to masters, are encouraged to enter this non-judged, fun-filled event, which is open to quilted apparel and objects, as well as quilts with the largest dimension no more than 64 inches. For those who would like to participate in the more restrictive "challenge within the challenge", from which a vote of the members will select eight quilts to submit to the American Quilters Society's "Ultimate Guild Challenge", the quilts must be between 30 and 60 inches in both length and width, and original in design.


