Molly Martinez Johnson, coordinator of the program at the Anderson Valley Adult School Even Start Program, will bring quilters, quilts and a film about their work. They are also publishing a book on their work.

Sign up Now for Curves Another Way!

Rebecca Rohrkaste, an award winning master quilter from Berkeley, CA will be teaching Curves Another Way on Thursday, March 19 from 10am-4 pm. Sign up now at Gualala Arts Center. This class is a bargain—\$50 for guild/GA members, \$60 for members of either and \$75 for non-members. Learn a versatile free-hand cutting and sewing technique for quarter circles. No templates and no pins! These blocks sew up quickly and can be combined in any of the Drunkard's Path arrangements. They also combine well with many other free-form cutting and sewing methods you may already know. We will go over many of the setting possibilities in class and work with color and pattern choices. Bring fabrics you'll enjoy working with. You'll have many "ingredients" for a new quilt by the end of the day. Rebecca comes to quiltmaking from a fine arts background and her work is marked by an original sense of color and fine craftsmanship, inspired by unexpected elements in antique and scrap quilts. Her quilt Full Circle won Viewer's Choice at Qullt National 2001. She will share her color sense as well as her designing and sewing techniques at her lecture at the March 20 guild meeting.

Intermediate Piecing Class Begins This Month

The intermediate piecing class taught by Mary Austin and Janet Sears begins Thursday, Feb. 26, from 9:30am to 12:30 pm in the Gualala Arts conference room and will cover the following topics:

- Feb. 26 Inset Piecing. Using templates for cutting, sewing inset seams, Attic Windows and Tumbling Blocks
- Mar.5 Continuing Inset Piecing LeMoyne Star (8 Pointed Star)- making seams meet in the middle and making star lie flat
- Mar. 12 Curved Piecing first the traditional way, then an easier way
- Mar. 26 Foundation piecing on muslin Log Cabin Block and Log Cabin variations
- Apr. 2 Foundation Piecing Using paper Flying Geese pattern
- Apr. 9 Variations using foundation paper piecing Combining techniques in one block Flying Geese circle Star variation, Resources for patterns, instructions, etc

Class members should have a working knowledge of basic piecing skills (rotary cutting, sewing 1/4 inch seams, pressing). Sign up at Gualala Arts any time before February 20. You may sign up for all six sessions; or, as space permits, you may attend one or more single sessions. Supply lists are available at Gualala Arts. Cost: Series for PPQG members, \$60, for GA members, \$80, for non-members \$100; individual classes for PPQG members \$10, for GA members \$15, for non-members \$20. Textile Painting Retreat Offered by Guild Members

Two PPQG members, Sue Friedland and Chris Smith, are teaming up to put on a *Textile Painting with a Spiritual Focus* retreat in Los Cabos, Mexico, March 6-12. Participants will be able to relax and have fun in Baja in beautiful accommodations overlooking the Sea of Cortez. Sue will supply the materials and teach the techniques she's developed for abstract textile painting, and she'll help students find their own voice through modification and extension of these techniques. Students will come away with design capabilities they didn't know they had, plus about three yards of handpainted fabric. There will also be optional meditations, demonstrations of meditative quilting, and advice on how to quilt and finish the painted pieces.
