It quickly and easily cuts up to 10 layers of fabric shapes for quilting, appliques. It is, at present, at Carol Tackett's house until she can get something to store the cutter on in our cupboard at GAC. It is so very easy to use. Marilyn Limbaugh and Carol are spending time to cut fabric kits for Quilts of Valor and Comfort Quilts for the January Workshop. They will also cut fabric for anyone who wishes to have their own fabric cut for this workshop. Carol cut all of the blocks for a quilt in about 20 minutes. So fast and easy.


