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African Textile Expert Rebecca Amissah-Aidoo to Speak

Our speaker for March will be Rebecca Amissah-Aidoo, who with her husband, Paajoe, established Ananse Village in Fort Bragg. Inspired by a trip to Paajoe's native Ghana, they were compelled to "give a hand up" to local individuals and communities who were living in poverty and in need of not only the necessities of life but of education and productive work. Rebecca and Paajoe connected with individual families, artists, and crafts people as well as non-governmental organizations working to improve local economies and conditions. One such group, Poverty Reduction Center, has provided

workspace, training, and materials for single mothers to learn the art of batik and to make batik cloth for sale in the marketplace. Rebecca and Paajoe commission and purchase cloth from this workshop as well as articles of their own design which supplement the products normally made.



Rebecca not only has degrees in

Fine Arts and invertebrate zoology, but is passionately devoted to textiles. An authority on the history of textiles with special knowledge of African textiles, she believes that women of all times and cultures are connected by the woven thread. She sees fabric not only as a cultural expression but as a mirror of individual uniqueness, saying that the textile artist must accept the responsibility of carrying on the legacy of cloth. Her lecture will include general comments about the history of textiles worldwide and specific information about the materials, techniques, and purposes of West African textile art. She promises to share some treasures from her personal collection and will bring lots of fat quarters to satisfy our shoppers.



This workshop The Fancywork Coat is designed to use some of the materials that have been saved for that special garment: the designer collection of fabrics, fabrics all in one colorway, buttons, beads, laces and treasured



fabrics. Students will learn how to combine some or all into a fanciful designer coat or a vest or wallhanging if you wish. Students may also personalize their garment further by adding hand embroidery, machine embroidery or other fancy stitchery techniques that Rachel will demonstrate. Sewing experience is recommended, but beginners are welcome too. This would be the perfect place to use the fabulous fabrics you are going to buy at the March lecture!
