Quilts of Valor & Comfort Quilt Workshop This Month

June Presents Another Opportunity to Honor Those Who Serve Us

The Guild will conduct a workshop at the Gualala Art Center on June 17 from 10 am to 3 pm to work on Quilts of Valor.

What are Quilts of Valor? These hand-made quilts are made by guilds around the country for injured veterans. Each quilt consists of a lap-sized, pieced, quilt-top, along with batting and backing. They are assembled by volunteers and given to injured recipients in and out of military hospitals around the world.

Over the past four years the members of the Gualala Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild have delivered over 100 Quilts of Valor to convalescing servicemen at the V.A. Hospital in Palo Alto. The coordinator of the project for PPQG, who personally delivers the quilts, Marilyn Limbaugh, reports that the wounded veterans are surprised and overwhelmed when they are presented with a Quilt of Valor. Our quilts have gone to a particular unit of servicemen and women who have sustained multiple traumatic injuries. Many seem unable to believe that someone they did not even know would make a beautiful quilt just for them. It is a small way for us to say Thank You and let them know they are appreciated and not forgotten.

For the coming year, we will need at least 25 Quilts of Valor. So, please, come help with a Quilt of Valor

project of your own or help others with cutting and pressing, assembly-line style. This is a great learning and bonding experience! Also, if you know anyone who wishes to help and is not a quilter, please let them know they can still participate by financing a quilt that Guild members will make. There are Comfort Quilt and Quilt of Valor labels at both the Loft and the Dolphin. There will be labels at the June workshop as well. Quilts of Valor Delivered

Carol Tackett and Marilyn Limbaugh delivered 28 Quilts of Valor to the V.A. hospital in Palo Alto on May 12. These were first put on display in the activity room of the convalescing veterans, and then servicemen that were mobile came in to view the quilts and make selections. Each one looked over all the quilts and carefully deliberated before picking a favorite. Two or three quilts were taken to the rooms of those servicemen confined to their rooms so they could make a selection. All the soldiers seemed surprised and overwhelmed when they received a Quilt of Valor. Many apparently could not believe someone they did not know would make a beautiful quilt just for them. It is a small way for us to the say "thank you" and let them know they are appreciated and not forgotten.


