Fort Ross Bicentennial Quilt Made by PPQG Members

For the past few months, Lola De Longoria, Joyce Gaudet and Laura Hamilton have been very busy working on a wall hanging quilt celebrating the 200th anniversary of Fort Ross. The quilt will be raffled off at the Harvest Festival at Fort Ross next October. The money raised from the sale of raffle tickets will support educational and interpretive programs and projects for the year 2012.

Making the quilt has been a fun and challenging time for Lola, Joyce and Laura. After 2 photographic field trips to the fort they chose a photograph of the chapel and proceeded to replicate that photo in fabric. With a lot of technique guesses and even more application of skills learned mostly at classes offered through PPQG the quilt is almost finished. At a "work in progress" Show and Tell at the PPQG Holiday Luncheon the oohs and aahs indicated a good job. The same was true at the Fort Ross Volunteer Appreciation Lunch the next day.

The really exciting part of all this is that Lola, Joyce and Laura have been invited to unveil the quilt at a formal reception at the Russian Embassy in San Francisco on January 26th. This is the kick-off for a year of fundraisers and events to celebrate the 200th anniversary. The quilt



will be shown and tickets will be sold at some of these events, including a couple at Gualala Arts Center. We will keep you updated in the newsletter about where and when the quilt is appearing.
