

Since then she has incorporated her love of color, texture and pattern into explorations of knitting, weaving, spinning, needlepoint and wearable art. For the past decade her passion has been in creating textile art for interiors with cloth, paint and stitch.

In her art she utilizes commercial & vintage fabrics with complex cloth of her own design. Fascinated by the merging of various fabrics with mixed heritage, she creates a new textile with depth,

layering and interest. With the dye and paint process she makes the exact fabric needed for each piece.

2012 Challenge is Right Around the Corner!

West Coast Splendor is the theme, so just look around you for some inspiration. Think about what you love about living here, then come up with a way to represent that quality or capture that feeling with fabric. Many people immediately think of a landscape or pictorial quilt, but there are so many different ways to represent the beauty that surrounds us. Consider well-known quilt patterns such as Storm at Sea, Mariner's Compass, etc. Or a simple patchwork arrangement of ocean colors. Or sunset colors. Or greens to represent our beautiful forests. The possibilities are endless. Lighthouses, horses, sheep, beaches, hiking trails, clouds, whales.

My goal for this challenge is to have at least one more participant than we had for last year's challenge. So if you made a quilt last year, good. Make one for this year. If you didn't have a quilt in the challenge last year, then you are the one who needs to make one this year.

Carol Tackett has graciously volunteered her services (and Kalynn's, too) to do drive-by stalkings, making sure we're all working on our quilts. I've been told that she will park in our driveways and not let us leave the house until the quilt is finished. Consider yourselves warned!
