

## Scavenger Hunt Quilt Class with Terry Waldron: March 15, 2012

Terry is a quilter, a teacher, and an author. She began quilting when her tennis partner left her for six weeks because of a "quilt class". Terry asked what was that, found a quilt shop, and was hooked. She was a secondary school teacher and now finds teaching quilting a joy. She will be teaching a one day workshop at GAC on March 15, 2012.

Participants in this Scavenger Hunt Quilt class are asked to bring five things which they must find, beg borrow or steal from anyone but DEFINITELY not buy. The list includes a new item that excites and you and you want to have on this quilt, an item that is or was alive, an item that was thrown away, but interests you, a picture, an item that is long and will create a line, and two more essentials— a sense of humor and a sense of adventure.

Students may also bring fabrics they LOVE, Wonder Under, glue sticks and a sewing machine, if they want one. Using the four principals of design, beginners and more advanced quilters can expect to come away with the start or a completed small art quilt, and ideas for future projects.
