0-5 yrs 6-15 yrs 16-25 yrs 26-35 yrs over 35 years


The graph shows the breakout of the 26 responses. Since, I am told, the guild has been in existence only 17 years, the last two answer options were irrelevant for question #2.

Blue represents answers to question #1 Beige represents answers to question #2.
