Thanks to all those who helped set-up and take down, thanks to those who volunteered to work in the booth each day, and a big thank you to those who made the items to be sold in our booth at Festival of Trees!!

We sold \$3,124 on Friday, and \$1,957 on Saturday, for a grand total of \$5,081.

Also remember your quilting tools, i.e. rulers, cutting mat, rotary cutter, neutral (lt gray or off white) and/or dark (navy or black) thread, quarter inch foot for your machine, power cords, scissors. Those who would like to work on the disappearing 4 patch quilts, a 6" square-up ruler would be useful.

Our goal is 50 quilts for the Veterans Monument dedication. This workshop could give us a good start toward the 33 quilts still needed to reach that goal. Hope to see you January 16

2026 Retreat

The hotel room cost is the same as last year, \$130.00 per night. For either a king bed or two queen beds. Call the hotel directly (707-584-0333) to make your reservation and be sure to tell them you are part of the PPQG Retreat in February. You will need a room for three nights. February 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, checking out on February 5th. We will be arriving at retreat on Monday and departing on Thursday. You will be paying for your hotel room on your own.

The cost for our work area and meals is going to be \$300.00 per person. Breakfast is included in the room cost. We will be having two catered dinners: our first night and our last night. Dinner on Tuesday and all lunches will be at our own expense. There are many restaurants nearby of different types and costs, some within walking distance.

I realize this is a higher cost than last year's retreat with fewer meals being provided. But, I wasn't happy with some of the meals we had last year so I want to use less of the hotel's catering. If you wish to pay the \$300.00 retreat cost in two installments, that is fine, as long as you are paid in full by January 26, which is one week before retreat. If you have not paid the full amount you will not be able to attend. Make the check payable to PPQG and mail it to Kim Madson at PO Box 1504, Gualala, CA 95445.

21 Oregon quilt artists were challenged to create a piece for the *Emergence* show, and this book takes you through each artists' process in selecting an image and executing it. In text and pictures over a generous six pages each you can follow each quilter's planning and execution with emphasis on the stumbling block that didn't go smoothly.

Title: *Design then Quilt — A dynamic guide to creating stunning modern quilts.*

Roderick takes you through the Elements and Principles of design in clear, easy to read, chapters. Then guides you in analyzing (critiquing) your design and making changes to improve it. Plenty of illustrations of what to do and not to do.

Sylvia Keller.....It is with a heavy heart that we report the passing of Sylvia Keller. She passed on December 4, less than a week shy of her 104th birthday.

Sylvia joined the guild at the annual picnic in July of 2007. She offered to teach a group of quilters how to hand applique. That grew into a small sewing circle that met every Tuesday at Sylvia's house for over 17 years.

Sylvia was a very active member of the guild. She served as the only Hospitality person for over two years, frequently brought food for Hospitality, made and donated comfort quilts, veterans quilts, table runners, wall hangings, pot holders and tote bags. Her notoriety was the many, many, many stuffed animals she made for not only PPQG, but also Project Santa and CLSD up until she was 100 years young. She was a very quiet, humble, special person, a prolific quilter, an inspiration and a treasure to have known.
